STATE FEDERATION MINUTES BROOKINGS, OREGON - JANUARY, 1965

Meeting was called to order at 10 o'clock by President, John Rathbun.

A letter from Stan Boak - offering to call free, a pre-registration dance in order to promote the pre-registration for the State Festival. The money taken in not for pre-registration may be kept in Area for expenses of dance.

They would appreciate any suggestions to encourage square dancing in their Area. He was sure their Area would be glad to exchange for hosting State meeting with Central Area.

Federation News Report: Brad Bradley, Circulation and Subscription Mgr., presented and explained budget and new type of ad called "Business Card: to be used by dancers rather than for clubs and dance ads. State-wide subscription and advertising campaign starting Jan., ending at State Festival, to get news on sound financial footing or changes will have to be made in subscription rates or size of magazine.

Faye Rathbun suggested having "problem corner" - a panel to give suggestions and help to any club, Area or dancer with problems concerning square dancing; also a "Party Planner" column to give ideas for square dancing activities.

Announcements: President, John Rathbun, announced that Scotty McCully, Editor of Federation News, is resigning and any suggestions for someone for this job would be appreciated.

President asked Pete Pettersen to turn the \$1500 Far Western money over to Ken Searl to be deposited in a special account for the next Far Western.

Mid-Winter Festival Report: Chairman, Buddy Randall - Co-Chairman, Dick Plane Buddy Randall reported that flyers have been sent out. No pre-registration-admission \$1.00 per day. There will be a past-officers dinner on Friday evening. He was quite concerned to see many areas and clubs scheduled special dances at this time and wondered if they are losing interest in having a Mid-Winter Festival.
