NATIONAL FOR FAR WESTERN Marv Kedroske of Portland lead the discussion.

Portland has been approached to sponsor a National. The bidding for a National is 2 years in advance. 25% is for the National and 75% to area sponsoring the event. Far Western held in 1963 in Emerald Empire Area - possibly one for 1972 - date can flucuate - also can control the dance. Big name callers are not anxious to go to a National. Far Western money would stay in our area. Far Western balance available of \$1,500. Delegates to take back to area - look into facilities-floor space would need same or more as in Seattle. (Jim Hill) Sound in coliseum is impossible and cost is \$2,400 a day, dance on cement but restaurants and motels are intersted. (John Budihas) Far Western good in Eugene - maybe Portland work with them. (Dean Chapman) Buddy Randle chairman of the 1963 Far Western. (Buddy Randle) Indicated other areas (outside of Oregon) interested in Far Western Verne McKnight made a motion that the delegates take information back to clubs to find out whether they are interested in a National or a Far Western. Seconded by Dean Chapman. Motion carried.
