OLD BUSINESS

Bob "Shep" Shepperd passed out a budget for the 1972 Far Western. The dates to be July 13, 14, 15, 1972 at the Memorial Coliseum, Portland, Oregon. It will be possible to have 8,000 dancing at one time. Will use the state wood floorall buildings are air conditioned - 200 square feet in main area - acoustical tile - round dancing in Georgia-Pacific Room - sound by Hilton -have security. Mentioned that a souvenir booklet would be expensive. A Chamber of Commerce booklet was presented to Gordon Seely, President. It will be necessary to sacrifice the State Festival in 1972 because the Far Western will need the cooperation that year.

Buddy Randall congratulated "Shep" Shepperd. He said that in 1963 Oregon, Nevada, Washington, Utah and Northern California were in favor of a Far Western and would like to see the Oregon Federation approve the budget and appoint "Shep" as chairman. In 1971 it can be advertised in New Orleans, the location of the National.

Question: Share in profits. The state hosting a Far Western has all the liabilities and receives the profits, if any.

Motion: A motion was made by Fred Kent to cast a unamimous vote that Portland, Oregon Area host the Far Western in 1972, approve the budget, and appoint "Shep" Shepperd as chairman, seconded by Mick Nogle. Motion passed.

Far Western has a balance of \$1,500 deposited with O.F.S.D.C.

Motion: A motion was made by Mick Nogle that the interest on the \$1,500 be retained in the general fund of the Oregon Federation of Square Dance Clubs, seconded by Jim Hill. Motion passed.

Presiden Gordon Seely had received correspondence from California State Square Dance Clubs to have Sept. 6 to Sept. 12 as square dance week. The state officers are in favor of the dates. The objective is to have a National Square Dance Week.

President Gordon Seely announced the 1970-71 state officers as follows:

President, Bill Sorenson (Dee); Vice President Verne McKnight (Ruth); Second Vice President, Dean Chapman: Treasurer, Shirley Lee (Frank); Recording Secretary, LaNola Bacon; Corresponding Secretary, Rita Midlam; and Membership Chairman, Alvin Boyer (Caddie).

FAIRVIEW DANCE (Leona Kale) A complete report was in the May 1970 issue of the OFN. \$420.15 was the profit and Fairview is looking forward to the 1971 dance.

NEW BUSINESS

Jim Hill, Past President and chairman of the nominating committee, stated that 133 ballots were mailed out and had a return of 107. This is the highest percentage ever and shows an interest by the clubs. 10 ballots returned did not follow instructions, please mention this to clubs.

ROUND DANCE DISUCSSION

Motion made by Jim Hill, seconded by Dean Chapman, round dance remain status quo. Motion passed. (Areas can always teach festival dances and extra dances. It can be an area decision.)

INSURANCE

Buddy Randall mentioned that insurance is a liability insurance and covers all events under one policy and it includes any function the state sponsors. The amount paid was \$1500. Other states have inquired about the insurance the Oregon Federation has. They do not have insurance. William M. Curry, Eugene Insurance Agency, 240 E. 12, Eugene, and associates are flying to Houston, Texas soon. If they are the agents for all 50 states, if this is possible, then the premium would be lower.

Motion: A motion was made by Verne McKnight, seconded by Jack Brinson, to raise admission 50¢ per person above registration fee at state functions and to start with the Mid-Winter Festival of 1971. Motion passed. (Note: The 50¢ above registration fee is to assist in paying the Oregon Federation insurance.)

President Gordon Seely thanked the Interstate Highlanders and their caller Bill Mayhew for the dinner, dance, and meeting. The officers and delegates had expressed their appreciation during the meeting.

The next meeting will be hosted by the Mid-Willamette Area and the dates are to be Sept. 19 and Sept. 20.

Motion to adjourn by Dean Chapman, seconded by Verne McKnight. Motion passed. Adjournment at 12:25 p.m.
