Motion: A motion was made by Bill Sorenson, seconded by Dean Chapman, that the excess amount of the 50¢ per person above the registration fee at state festivals and mid-winter festivals go into the floor fund to be used for a future insurance policy. Motion passed.

Bob "Shep" Shepperd inquired about the floor. Buddy Randall explained that the state wood floor is being sold and replaced so a better floor will be available.

Discussion re transporting floor - Emerald Empire board have discussed a common carrier for transportation and when the floor goes out that someone should supervise the transporting and laying of the floor

Adjourned for coffee 11:15 a.m.

Discussion re funds and profits of Far Western. Buddy Randall explained that the state hosting a Far Western has the liabilities and receives the profits. Oregon will host so the state shares in committ. work. \$1500 from the 1963 Far Western was set aside.

NEW BUSINESS AND INSTALLATION of 1970-71 Officers

Installing chairman was John Budihas (Joy) of Portland. John aptly expressed/of his hand fable duty. The 69-70 officers were presented with an Albertina Spruce tree (grows about an inch a year). The 70-71 officers received a Concolor White Fir (grows from 6 to 10 inches a year). John requested a-now-picture and a-year-from-now picture. Also the officers received a treasure chest of gifts from areas near Salem. (And thanks to Bill and Nola Austin, George and Bernice Gruchalla, Al and Evelyn Miller and the many lovely friends from the Mid-Willamette Area for the dance, meeting, gifts and dinner.

Officers installed: President Bill Sorenson (Dee); First Vice President, Verne McKnight (Ruth); Second Vice President Dean Chapman (Marcia); Recording Secretary, LaNola Bacon; Corresponding Secretary, Rita Midlam; Treasurer, Shirley Lee (Frank); and Membership Chairman, Alvin Boyer (Caddie).

Before installation the previous delegates introduced the new delegates from their area.

President Bill Sorenson asked the many square dancers from the Rogue Sis-Q Area to stand. Also present at the installation was the Sorenson's daughter Susan from Oregon State University.

President Sorenson announced that the state reporter would be Leona Kale (Frank) and the historian to be June Kingsbury (Mil).

Konnie Worth (Churchill Tours, 1137 SW Yamhill, Portland, Oregon 97205) talked to the group about a trip to Europe (Scandinavian Countries) for about 2 weeks in early December 1971, Forms were available for area delegates. The square dancers of the Oregon Federation would visit Norway, Sweden and Denmark. They would have an

opportunity to perform, to visit and, on some occasions to stay with Scandinavian families. If 125 couples would charter an airplane the cost would be estimated \$600 per person round trip; 50 couples or more the fare would be \$800 per person round trip. A \$100 deposit would be required by Jan. 1, 1971. For additional information write to Gordon Seely, Rt. 2, Box \$40\$, Woodburn, Oregon 97071. A public relation tip—when you finish performing—do a dance step from each country visited-Konnie would teach the steps to the group.

Discussion about square dancing becomming the National Dance of USA. John Morris, Portland, referred group to Ore. Fed. meeting minute of 1/12/69. "A motion was made by Bob Davis, seconded by Dean Chapman that the resolution be accepted by OFSDC. Motion carried." The resolution was signed by President Sorenson and forwarded to John Casey, Chm. Nat. Sq. Dance Com., SCVSDA, PO Box 722, Los Gatos, Calif. 95130 and a signed copy to Keith Marcuson, Amer. Legion Post 15D PO Box 912, Los Gatos, Calif. 95130. A copy was retained for a permanent record.

Ruth and Verne McKnight will see that the frayed banner is cleaned and repaired. Jack Brinson will search for a recording of the Star Spangled Banner to be played at state events. He will forward information to Verne and Ruth McKnight.

President Sorenson will ask the officers to assist with writing the President's Corner this year.

Past President Gordon Seely, Chm. of the nominating committee for 70-71 officers announced the following committee: George Ullrich, Ernie Holthus, John Budihas and Buddy Randall. The nominating committee will meet during the Mid-Winter Festival.

Norman Butts (Rogue Sis-Q delegate) announced that the South Coas would host the May state meeting. Rogue Sis-Q will be busy with the June 1971 State Festival.

Money from the areas for the directories should be forwarded to Dean Chapman, Second Vice President.

Guests at the meeting were Ken and Venita Enyart of the Washingto. Federation. Their state festival is scheduled the same time as Oregon OFSDC will keep in touch with the Washington Federation to avoid a conflict of dates for future state festivals.

Motion: A motion was made by Dean Chapman, seconded by Verne McKnight to buy and display the US and Oregon flag at meetings. (An official US and Oregon flag.) Motion passed. Verne and Ruth McKnight will inquire about the flags.

President Sorenson expressed his appreciation to the area. Portland area will host the January meeting. The date will be announced later.

A motion was made to adjourn. Time 1:15 p.m.
