The delegates suggested that more could be done by flyers, dancing at County Fairs, giving free coupons for free lessons etc., did more for advertising than running adds in the papers, which is much more expensive.

Ray Scofield: Suggested that we needed more guide lines, before handing money out, such as how much - how it would be spent - who would take care of disbursing the funds.

Shirley Lee: Reported that she was opposed to giving out funds for advertising as the State owes an obligation to pay back the share holders of the state floor first.

After much discussion a motion was made by John Ketchum and seconded by Jay Clark; The motion was to send out letters to the share holders and see if they would like their money back. Roll call was made of the delegates and the motion passed.

Nat Dicianna: Made a motion that we table the idea of giving the areas any money for publicity until the results of the floor shares be known. The motion was seconded and passed.

Jay Clark: Made a motion that the square dance posters be given to the areas free. Motion was seconded and passed.

0. F. N. Binders: Ed Warmoth: reported that we have received 400 green binders at the old price. He asked that the delegates pick up their areas binders at the hospitality booth and pay the State treasurer for them.

It was suggested that Bend look into buying and selling a floor in their area and make a proposal at the next meeting.
