CENTRAL OREGON - RAY MURRAY (DOROTHY)

The next State meeting will be hosted by the Central Oregon area on August 21 (dance) and August 22 (meeting) All functions to be held at the Inn of the Seventh Mountain (7 miles SW of Bend on Century Drive. Dance will be held on an outside floor (particle board) or inside if there is rain. Packet was given to each delegate and state officer with information to make reservations for state meeting (there are also facilities in Bend if anyone wishes to stay there (at a lower rate)

FASTERN OREGON - BEN WRIGHT (DELIA) Announced Area Council dance in Weston on 5th Saturday, May 1976, also the Western Pioneer picnic association has invited the Square Dancers for old time and then modern exhibition. Information given to each delegate and officer regarding the Pendleton Round Up and dance (to be held on Saturday September 18, 1976) with callers Phil Jamison (Pendleton) and Ricky Anglin (Elgin)

EMERALD EMPIRE - JOHN NASHOLM (BEVERLY) At last area meeting had nomination of officers the next area meeting will be June 5 at Emerald Park with River Road Mixers hosting. Emerald Area tries to follow the order of the state meeting. Present at last meeting was State President and Portland delegation for Summer Festival. Cascade Callers of the Emerald Empire--regarding...Fairview, how handling the Fairview dance. Voted by club delegates rather than have in Bi-Laws that proceeds of 5th Saturday dance go to Fairview----vote each year and designate where to be used,--perhaps another project. Emerald Empire also had discussion regarding State donation to Fairview each year, perhaps consider another worthy cause. Next years officers look into and perhaps a committee formed to study this. Rather than a certain cause have the area delegates vote on where money to be designated.

INTERSTATE HIGHLANDERS - LEONARD SCOTT (DONNA) (Alternate Delegate) Announced they would be holding their area dance and meeting next week end.

LINCOLN TILLAMOOK - EARL AYERS (CHAROLETTE) Lincoln Tillamook area in favot of three meetings a year (due to cost of having State Meetings) July 31 date of next area meeting and dance—hosts Toledo 49ers.

MID WILLAMETTE AREA - RUTH McKNIGHT (VERNE) Fairview benefit dance first started with the Chapel fund, had been suggested by Frank and Leona Kale. Mid Willamette area started on a plan for choosing the Round of the Month. Choosing of the Rounds to be kept within the areas--12 dances to be chosen each year. The plan for choosing the round is to have three dances chosen then taught to those who would be voting (two representatives from each club) and then a final vote to choose the round dance. At the April meeting the Mid Willamette area voted and selected Apron Strings (ROM for July 1976)

Paul was always willing to call and willing to loan out his sound equipment. He enjoyed teaching beginner dancers and enjoyed all levels of Square Dancing. Mid Willamette Area election of officers will be held May 17, have had more interest in elections this year, have two or more candidates for each office. It has been suggested that the information printed on our State Ballots for State candidates contain information of both husband and wife (officers are thought of as a couple job)

PORTIAND AREA COUNCIL - BOB INGLIS (DOROTHY) Portland Area Council has chosen as Square Dance week--September 13-17. The Rose Festival Dance is scheduled for Friday June 11 at the Memorial Coliseum in Portland. In regard to Summer Festival, commercial booth space is available, also rooms at the Holiday Inn (eight to ten) Anyone wishing to host an after party contact Bob Inglis.

ROGUE SIS Q - PAUL CULLOP (MARY) On the 4th of July the area performing at the Ashland Festival (200 years of Square Dancing)

SOUTH COAST - JOHN VAN LANDINGHAM (GERI) Council will install area officers June 29 in Brookings at the Azalea Festival.

SUNSET - ART FAUST (RUBY) No Report.

TEEN AREA - JEFF DORN MDA dance will be August 20 (Friday) at Smith Memorial Center (Portland State University-Portland) Callers will be Ivan Midlam and Jim Steele. Teen Area voted to hold four area dances a year.

THREE VALLEY AREA - DUANE HANDYSIDE (DONNA) Area has elected new area officers, and has been preparing for this dance and meeting. Area caller-Bud Rogers had been invited and attended the Caller Lab meeting this year in Chicago.

UMPQUA AREA - HOWARD RAHN (GEORGENE) Absent--no report.

OLD BUSINESS

Paul Cullop, Rogue Sis Q, tourist information - delegates asked to take and place in tourist information booths under label Square Dance information here, the copies of Where and When.

Verne McKnight—need decision on use of money from the Fairview Dance this year, the suggestions: Special playground equipment, Hearing Test Machine, Furnish interior of Patterson cottage. Amount \$1046—to be used. Votes were in favor of money to be designated for Patterson Cottage.

AL WESTPHAL presented GUIDELINES FOR SELECTION OF ROUND DANCE OF THE MONTH (Easy Rounds for Square Dancers) prepared by Lloyd Ward at the request of President Graham Wood.

Phase I as follows:

- 1. Type of Record
- 2. Level of Complexity
- 3. Pattern Flow
- 4. Instruction Sheet
- 5. Music danceable
- 6. Steps and Figures easy level
- 7. Teachability (can be taught in 25 minutes or less)

This was discussed, and a motion made by Al Westphal and seconded by Ann Lauderdale that the State approve these Guidelines. Motion carried. A copy of same will be sent to each area. President Graham Wood will appoint an Advisory Panel that areas may contact, if they wish (not compulsory) when they are making their selection of a Round Dance of the Month. The panel would have available a list of dances that

would be suitable for a Round of the Month, to be shown by anyone wishing to present a dance.

Phase II was discussed but not adopted at this time by the State.

Eliminate the 12 Rounds a year -go to 6 a year for area selection
6 extras to be chosen by panel..might include old classics, and
easy rounds taught at Festivals.

Clubs should turn these copies into their area Secretary who keeps one copy, one copy goes to the Membership Chairman and another to the Second Vice President for use in compiling the Directory. Directory Deadline is June 25.

ED WARMOTH Information for Showcase display at the National Convention at Anaheim should be sent along with those going to Anaheim.

If each area selects its rounds of the month on the basis of these guidelines, problems which have sometimes occurred in the past should be avoided.

PROJECT EASY ROUNDS FOR SQUARE DANCERS

Your State President Graham Wood has asked me to develop a proposal, plan or set of guidelines aimed toward insuring that Rounds of the Month in Oregon are rounds that are clearly in the easy level category.

I have received suggestions & ideas from round dance teachers, callers, and square dance level and higher level round dancers. The proposals I am including are not all my original thinking but are rather the collective thinking of a number of quite knowledgeable people, all of whom are interested in furthering easy level round dancing at square dances in the State of Oregon.

I have prepared two plans in response to the Presidents request.

The first plan which I will call Phase One will be a set of very specific guidelines for areas to use in the selection process. Phase One follows:::

1. TYPE OF RECORD *** Rounds should preferably be selected from square and round dance labels. " Pop " labels have good music but the record can become unavailable very quickly. Square dance labels are generally available in quantity. If an area selects a " Pop " label dance they MUST make certain that the record is currently available in quantity. The primary Oregon supplier or dealer is Gateway Records, they should be able to determine availablity of records.

2. LEVEL OF COMPLEXITY ***

- A. Is the routine short enough that dancers, callers, teachers can easily remember it?
- B. Does the dance have sequences that are repeated, an easy level round usually does.
- C. A dance that has awkward positions for either man or lady should be avoided.

 Dance the dance before selection is made, be certain that the "gimmick" step will be one that ALL the dancers in the state can master in a short time.
- D. A square dance level round should NOT centain any of the steps or figures as are listed on Appendix A. These steps are recognized as intermediate level steps, and are NOT appropriate to an easy level round dance.

- 3. PATTERN FLOW *** The dance should flow smoothly with the music- the music should tell the dancer that he is doing Part A or B. Preferably the sequence should be Part A, B, A, B, ending. Mixed up sequences are difficult for most any dancer to remember, we should all enjoy doing the dance not make a memory contest out of it.

 4. INSTRUCTION SHEFT *** The instruction sheet for the dance should be clearly written using standard terminology in up to date form. If one is not sure exactly what the choreographer means in the instruction sheet, then consider carefully whether it should be an Oregon ROM.
- 5. MUSIC *** Is the music good danceable music- generally square dance labels meet the requirements and they do fit the normal sequence of measures that make up easy level dances.
- 6. STEPS & FIGURES *** Oregon rounds of the month in either two step or waltz rhythm should contain ONLY steps, figures, or positions that are listed on the attached sheets.

Appendix B- Easy level two step basic steps, figures & positions.

Appendix C- Easy level waltz basic steps, figures & positions.

If a dance being considered has any step, figure or position referred to in Appendix A- it should not be considered easy level. Selectors must remember that the dance will be danced by dancers through out the state, they won't all have the same amount of training or time to learn the dance.

7. TEACHABILITY *** A round of the month must be one that can be taught by an average Oregon square dance caller or teacher in 25 minutes or less. If the dance is so complex that it takes longer, too many callers will simply not teach the dance.

SUMMARY ***

The guidelines presented above will enable round dancing to become increasingly popular again, past experience this year has indicated the need for such guidelines. I would urge the guidelines Phase One be adopted as an interim measure and that for the long term, Phase Two be given consideration as the BEST solution to furthering the growth of both round and square dancing...

- 5. Impetus Turn, (Banjo pivot, Heel pivot)

- 9. Chassee
- 10. Double Reverse Turn

Note: The fish tail step is classified as intermediate if the dance has this step be certain that dancers will be able to master the technique...
