OREGON FEDERATION OF SQUARE AND ROUND DANCE CLUBS Minutes of State Meeting held November 1, 1981 Lane County Fair Grounds, Eugene, Oregon

The meeting was called to order by President Phil Rennick at 9:03 a.m.

A motion was made by First Vice President, Vern Meyer to dispense with reading of the minutes of last meeting. Motion seconded and carried.

Sent letter to Rainier including all copies of letters she had protesting commercial, also letter to Bob Osgood, of Square Dancing Magazine. Read letter received from Rainier, a copy attached hereto and by reference made a part hereof. Received a copy of letter from Bob Osgood which he sent to Rainier with correspondence to the executive secretary of Legacy. Have the applications for nominations for the delegates with one for each club in each area.

Membership Chairman Duane Handyside - Have one new club in the Federation, Christian Crosstrailers of Grants Pass, which brings membership to 147 clubs.

Parlimentarian Buddy Randall - Have Up-date of the consititution and By-laws which each delegate and officer received. Delegates please take your copies and make enough copies for each club in your area.

Financial Advisor Jean Brigl - Gave delegates and officers copy of publication #557 from IRS on Social and Recreation Clubs, on how to apply and retain exempt status for your organization.

State Reporter Bill Baisch - No report. The Baisch of Park Baisch

State Historian, Jack Williams - Showed a plaque Oregon State Federation received at Seattle for show case of ideas from the National Chairman. Asked all areas to send information on your special events in to him.

Education Chairman Jimmy Carney - Interviewed people in area and no one interested in panels. Suggest take a vote on different alternatives. 1. Have a clinic with various speakers and a discussion. 2. Have a publicity round-table discussion. 3. Have a table with hand-outs to give people that are interested. 4. Do nothing. Vote by raise of hands indicated number three (3) was selected. Suggestion made we have a data bank of books and articles. He asked all delegates if they have any books on their library shelf, or books from anyone pretaining to square dancing, if they could bring them to the Mid-Winter Festival to add to the data bank. To get people to thinking about club leadership in their areas, maybe they would like to have their own mini legacy. There is a book put out by the National Organization. It contains articles helpful to clubs on finance, how to conduct meetings, etc.. Jim suggested having a copy printed for each delegate, which would cost around \$100, to be given to them at Mid-Winter Festival.

Jack Williams also asked for a table at Mid-Winter Festival for the Historian books.

DELEGATES REPORTS:

Central: Francis Bortner - Eleven couples took an RV mystery trip to McCloud, CA. The Harvest Hoedown in Madras was a big success, about 17 squares. Preparing for a two day festival in Prineville on August 20-21,1982. The first in an annual endeavor. Slick Fox will be the featured caller for Saturday afternoon work shop and Saturday night dance. Bill Dalrymple is arranging for the round dance cuer. Ron Meisner is in charge of the Friday night jamboree with state callers. Plenty of RV parking at \$2.50 per day. The dance will be held in same building as 1980 festival with plywood floor. Slick Fox calling plus one and two dances in Bend on the 2nd and 4th Fridays.

Eastern Oregon: George Griffith - Grand Squares started square dance lessons and have 10 squares of new dancers. Gave an introduction party to get people interested in square dancing, this should be planned well ahead of time so people can put it into their schedule. Rocket Squares will start lessons in January. Square Knots have 31 new dancers at their lessons.

Emerald Empire: Leon Houle' - Area welcomed all officers and delegates. Are hosting a catered luncheon after meeting. Benefit dance to follow at 1:30 for sound in big hall of fair grounds.

Interstate Highlanders: Bill Deasy - No report.

Lincoln-Tillamook: Russ Huffman - No report.

Mid-Willamette: Floyd Carson - Area had a very successful Fall Festival on October 31st. The areas new dancers lessons are going well. First New Dancers Dance will be on November 29th at the Elks Lodge, Corvallis. Area is not pleased with the new directory, one club left out and two clubs listed that no longer exist.

Portland: Genevieve Churchill - State directories sales going well. Some addresses are printed wrong. Motion made and approved to send letter of protest to Rainier. There is a singles meeting in Portland this day concerning pulling the singles and their activities together.

Rogue-Sis-Q: Frank Young - Have one new club as mentioned earlier, the Christian Crosstrailers. New potential square dancers dinner was well received and over 200 people attended. Lessons started in September and more to start in January. Our student mid-way dance will be December 13th.

South Coast: Kathy Ash - Absent

<u>Sunset</u>: Del Niemi - Hayshakers reported their Indian Summer Days Dances were a huge success as well as the pie and ice cream social. Clatskanie Promenaders had a masquerade dance last Saturday. Hayshakers have 5 squares of new dancers at lessons. Promenaders will begin lessons January 3rd. Fund-raising events for Fairview benefit are in the making for both clubs and the Council. More on this next time.

Three Valley: David Stutzman - No report

Tualatin Valley: Cliff Robinson - Are conducting a survey of class members as to where they got interested in square dancing, to see if all our exhibitions really pay off. Area has 6 to 8 celebrations in the area such as County fair, Tigard Town & Country Days, etc. Last year we were put at 3 different locations at the same time, which resulted in sparse turnout in dancers and spectators. The times and locations were also poor. Are getting dancers to attend the meetings of the sponsoring organizations to try to get better locations and times. Are holding new dancer dances again in conjunction with regular club dances.

Umpqua: Wes Hammack - All square dance classes are going well in the area.

Back to Jimmy Carney - Reported House Bill H.J. RES, 151 to make the Square Dance the National Dance is before congress now and needs more support for passage this term. Suggested club secretaries print message on postcard and each club member buy and sign and send one to our congress members urging passage of this bill. Handed out print-offs on the bill and example of cards to all present. Legacy put out a questionaire in Seattle and reported results from these indicated many unhappy with square dancing.

1982 Mid-Winter Festival - Leon Houle', co-chairman - Needing people to pre-register.

Have a tentative schedule made up on the wall and asking for any suggestions or comments on it. Handed out booklets to all at meeting and asked people take them back to clubs.

1982 Fairview Dance - George Winterfeld, reporting - Clint and Lucille Barnes have been in touch with Fairview. Fairview is very interested in Leisure Center. They have received permission from the legislature to go ahead and build it. This will be a seperate building near the chapel. Estimated cost is \$275,000.00. Will be other groups helping out with this project. Suggest square dancers go towards a certain room, furniture, or etc. Would like ideas to take back to them.

1982 Summer Festival - Frank Young - Asking for pre-registration. Wood floors for rounds and square dancing. Plus 1 and 2 dancing also. The main floor in the arena area will be covered. Will have a style show and lots more.

Vern & Ruth McKnight - Have not traveled between these past two meetings.
