OFFICER REPORTS

PRESIDENT: Lee (Barbi) Ashwill

Genevieve, please accept our condolences for the loss of your sister. You have our heart felt feelings from this Committee.

I want to thank the Rogue Sis-Q Council for a wonderful meal and a great dance last night and for hosting this meeting today. Thank you John and Glory and thank your committee and council. Thank you to all the dancers who worked to make this a great weekend.

I want to thank everybody in here for their cards, letters, emails, and prayers, I sincerely appreciate it.

I am still collecting information from all the Clubs and councils regarding what they do during the year in the way of charitable contributions, volunteering or anything else that they do that are not seen by the general population. I have received input from: Sunset Empire Council; TVC; River City Dancers; B&B's; The Happy Hoppers; the Recycles; Central Oregon Council and the Sets-In-Order. I picked up two more today from MWA and PAC, but I know that there is a whole lot more going on out there. I will extend the time for submission to the July 2010 State Meeting. Following that meeting I will get together with Tony Haskins and we will see what we can put together for a news article. Hopefully if we have enough noteworthy charitable accomplishments, the newspaper will be willing to give us some positive press. I would hope that such a news item would help us to recruit new dancers for the beginning of the September 2010 lessons. If I don't get this information soon, it won't help us with this years recruiting. Let's get the word out. To do that I need your help. If any of you Delegates have contact information for local newspapers, please get that to either Tony or myself and we will try to get some of the smaller media newspapers to print an article also. People need to know what we do and we do a lot. When you start counting it up, those hours, the contributions, it's amazing and I would sure like to get us some positive publicity.

I would like to talk to you for just a moment about the National Convention coming up in Spokane in 2012. The National Executive Committee finally did a very positive thing. They have reduced the price for youth to half the registration price. So on the early registration of \$40 youth is \$20. On the registration which starts right after their pre-convention, which is \$50 youth will be \$25 and the at-door registration or late registration \$60 and the youth will be \$30. So any of you that what to have a great time and dance to the greatest callers in the world be sure and register to go. We are very

fortunate in Oregon. As I travel around some of the State, we've got, probably hands down, the best callers and cuers that we have run in to. But when you go to a National Convention you get them from everywhere and it is a great experience. This is probably the closest it is going to be to you for a long time. So, if you have kids, grandkids, register them and get them over to Spokane. Definition of youth is between ages 5 and 17 at time of Convention. Under 5 are free.

Last item I would like to mention is get registered for Summer Festival. Kay's got a bank account sitting there without much money in it and they want her to put some money in it. So get those registrations in. Let's make Pendleton a time to remember. As she told you last night, with Marshall Flippo, if you don't have a good time it is going to be your own fault. And again, we've got our great Oregon callers up there and we are fortunate.

Lee Ashwill: I need to appoint a committee to count the ballots. Linda Putzler, Kathy Roberts and Barbi Ashwill have agreed to do this.

1st VICE PRESIDENT: Floyd (Jill) Bard

I have received proposed changes to the P&Ps from the BMI/ASCAP Coordinator, Publicity and State Reporter, and 1st Vice President. I was told that the Recording Secretary sent a change to the P&Ps and for some reason I didn't get it. So we will take those changes and do it next meeting. Also, in addition to the P&P changes sent to me there will be proposed changes for the Grant Committee; the Reimbursement, Lodging and Mileage Expense section; and the Elected Officer and Delegate section.

It is past time for the Area Councils to entertain the idea of hosting the 2012 Summer Festival. In fact, it would be best if there were applications for both 2012 and 2013 Summer Festivals. From the last State meeting at Mid-Winter, I asked for each Delegate to address hosting a Summer Festival at their next area meeting. During your Delegate Report, I would like to hear what the results were from your area meeting for hosting a Summer Festival. I know it is going to be hard because 2012 is going to be the National Convention in Spokane and I know that is going to be difficult. We need the areas to look at their ability and come with a proposal for a Summer Festival for 2012 and 2013.

2010 Mid-Winter Festival: Sandy (Chuck) Eddings

First and foremost we would like to again thank all of the dancers in Oregon, Washington, Idaho, California, Minnesota, and Alaska for attending the 50th Anniversary of Oregon Mid-Winter Festival, all of these dancers made the "Golden Jubilee" the great success it was.

We had a final total of 1369 dancers, which was the biggest ever in Albany. We had nothing but good feedback from the dancers. Everyone seem to like Gary Shoemake our featured caller, Kristine and Bruce Nelson our round dance cuers, and our featured Clogging Instructor Scotty Bilz. Everyone enjoyed the whole weekend. The Cloggers leading in the Grand March was a great asset to the weekend and the dancers seemed to really enjoy the entertainment.

As a Festival we were able to present the Oregon Federation with a check. We also presented the Emerald Empire, as our sponsoring area with the same amount. We

are very proud to have been Chairman of the 50th Anniversary of the Mid-Winter Festival. Our committee is the best group of people we have ever worked with. We can't thank them enough for the job they did as a team to make this Festival the greatest ever. We will continue to advise and support all upcoming Mid-Winter Festivals and promote Square Dancing, Round Dancing, and Clogging as long as we are able. Thank everyone again for making this such a great experience for Chuck and myself.

2010 Summer Festival: Kay (Jim) Rogers

You notice that they had over 1,000 people at Mid-Winter. Summer Festival currently has 190 registered.

The Summer Festival Committee has distributed packets to the Delegates and some officers here today. These are in place of a program booklet, because when you have 190 people registered you don't want to be printing program books. You will notice they are not sealed. That is a dual-purpose plan:

1. Open the envelope and distribute flyers, etc, to dances and halls where you dance.
2. Use the envelope for something else. Recycle!

There is so much planned for Summer Festival you won't want to miss it, starting with the free dance on Thursday night. It is my understanding that there are several callers that want to call that night. Then we are going to have an ice cream social afterwards with tickets at \$5 each. It is a buffet; make your sundae type ice cream. We are still accepting entertainment offers from you club or group.

Friday dancing from 10am – 10pm, including workshops with Marshall Flippo and round dance workshops with Susan Healea and Ron Woolcock.

Saturday dancing from 10am – 10pm including workshops and sessions with Fiddlegrass Band and The Crew.

Daryl Clendenin and Les Seeley are our caller and cuer coordinator. They are putting on a program that you just wouldn't want to miss. By themselves they are great but they have brought in a lot of wonderful callers to be on our program.

On Sunday the Heavenly Hoedown will be with The Crew and live music with Fiddle Grass Band.

There will be a showcase of rounds, a River City Rider exhibition, and there is a bluegrass band on tap for a terrific after party hosted by PAC for 2011 Summer Festival.

Zola Jones: Thank you Kay. I can follow it up with I can't encourage people enough to come and dance to Marshall Flippo. He is special, he is a type of caller you don't see anywhere you go and there are very few left like him in our Country.

As most of you know we go south in the wintertime for about 2 ½ months in Southern Arizona. We get to Yuma, Arizona, the first week in February. We do attend their special festival and we always take pre-registration for Summer Festival to that one. By the time we get to Tucson it is in March and some dancers have already left. They have a lot of Oregon dancers in Southern Arizona. There are also ones from Washington, Idaho, and Northern California down there. I think it would behoove upcoming Summer Festivals to mail pre-registration forms down to contacts in Yuma who would be Ron and Mary Noble and to Tucson care of Ray and Virginia Walls. I know they would be happy to put these registration forms out because all the dancing down there is caller and cuer

run. They have folders with flyers in them that they put out at all of their workshops and their dances and their festivals. If you can find a contact in Mesa, that is another good place to mail out pre-registrations forms by January to these people. I think you would get some response from it.

Lee Ashwill: Zola, did you say that Marshall did not have any when you talked to him?

Zola Jones: Yes, when we were there in March he had not received any. I gave him a bunch of flyers I had. I know if you contacted Ron and Mary Noble in Yuma and Ray and Virginia Walls in Tucson they would be glad to receive flyers from you.

Floyd Bard: Thank you Zola. I can tell you that supporting the Summer Festivals I think is even more important than the Mid-Winter. They are all important. The Mid-Winter is in the same location and we all know when it is and it is always the same weekend. The Summer Festivals have seen some issues we have had to deal with. As a Federation we are going to have to look at the Summer Festivals in the future to find out what solutions we can make to make these successful. It is important not only for the dancers to get together and dance to National callers but it is also a resource for the Federation as well.

2011 Mid-Winter Festival: Larry (Carol) Reetz

We are well on our way. Committee members are getting out on visitations to clubs and council dances promoting the 2011 Mid-Winter. We will be at Summer Festival and look forward to being there. A number of us have our registrations done so we will be there.

One of the things that is a good indicator as to how Mid-Winter is doing is what the pre-registration is like. We have 55 RVs that pre-registered at the 2010 Mid-Winter Festival. If we do above 40-45 we know that we're doing soundly and doing well. There were 78 ribbons purchased at the same time. This helps to provide a good financial base as we move forward.

Some of the things we have been doing are a few years ago they purchased a computer program for Used Clothing. That program has had issues. We found that there is a Tech Support for that program however. It doesn't necessarily solve the problems. We are looking at upgrading it. We also know that the new program is compatible with QuickBooks. QuickBooks is a program we are trying to utilize as our treasurer program. With that interface it will help us to better manage and better support the dancers. One of the other options it provides is that we can provide bar codes in small amounts up to five. Under the current program if you provide bar codes you have to provide a full sheet of bar codes to that one person and they might only use five out of thirty. It is going to provide a smoother interface there.

In recent years we have experienced some issues with our sound quality. Working with Mike Kious and our callers and Roger Putzler, who has been advising a lot and helping with sound, and different individuals that are very familiar with the sound systems, we discovered that we really did not have the proper cables for sound. We are going out and purchasing brand new cables that meet the requirements of the speakers we use. This should improve the sound quality in the halls and give us a better opportunity. One of the other things we discovered is that the cables have been stored in our storage

area. This does not help because, what ever the reason is, the cool temperatures that are in there degrade the cables. In the future those cables will be maintained in a home atmosphere between Mid-Winters. That will extend the life of our cables. These are just some of the issues we are trying to do.

One additional thing, this has been batted around for a number of years. We are going to try something this next year. We will have opening ceremonies on Friday evening. On Saturday night immediately after the Showcase of Rounds, we will not have a Grand March. We will have a flag presentation. We will have the short little speeches with the mayor and such. After the Randall Award presentation we will start square dancing. Last year we stood on the floor for 1 hour and 10 minutes from the time people started to line up to when we finally finished. Grand Marches have been a tradition, I am well aware of that. A lot of our people enjoy them and new dancers kind of get a thrill. We are going to try it and see what kind of feedback we get. I may take a hit on it but it is something that we will see what everybody feels like.

2011 Summer Festival: Tony Haskins

The 2011 Summer Festival is in full swing. We have been meeting each month accordingly, to make sure we haven't overlooked anything and all of our ducks are in a row. We have finalized our registration form and it is now ready for printing. We are going to print about 1,000 of them for the Pendleton Summer Festival. So I expect a lot more people there than 190.

We have also finalized our logo for the T-Shirts we are selling for the festival. They will be ready for sale at the 2010 Summer Festival in Pendleton. They are priced at \$10.00 each. These are very nice shirts.

Our hand-made quilt is finished. It's very beautiful. Dixie Read from the Checkerboard Squares Dance Club did a wonderful job. Keith Miles also helped with the design and implementation of the Square Dancers on each corner of the quilt and the design in the middle of the quilt. Thanks to both Dixie and Keith for doing this.

Bill and Annadale Rooper are getting our raffle for the Dinner Boat Trip ready. This will be on the Sternwheeler Dinner Boat with a trip up the Columbia.

The raffle tickets for both the Quilt and Dinner Boat will be available at the Registration Table at the 2010 Summer Festival.

Our Festival Ribbons have been ordered and received. I ordered 20 caller ribbons with 20 more for the cuer's and 25 Solo. When I first received them I had 20 callers, 20 cuer, 25 solos, and then 800 more solo. Holy smokes, I though!!! We're going to have a lot of single people!!! Of course, I reordered – showing Triple A their mistake and it was taken care of. Well, ahhh oh you know me – I just had to mess with someone so I called Bill Rooper who is our festival treasurer and told him what had happened and that Triple A wanted another \$200.00 for reprinting. Oh Lord, my word, you don't want to hear what he had to say – I let him steam awhile, then I told him I was just kidding. He settled down. I've got to quit that crap before I give him heart failure.

Les Seeley is doing a fine job putting together the Saturday After Hours Party in Pendleton for us. He and Daryl Clendenin will be calling with the Fiddle Grass Band with callers from the floor. Daryl Clendenin will be doing the Friday After Hours Party at Mid-Winter 2011 for us. Thanks to both Les and Daryl.

The Summer Festival Ad has been approved and sent to Kay Rogers for her program book. It has also been sent to Larry Reetz for the 2011 Mid-Winter Directory.

Lee Ashwill: Tony, when will your raffle tickets going to be available?

Tony Haskins: They will be available at Summer Festival 2010.

2012 Mid-Winter Festival: Roger (Linda) Putzler

Just mark your calendars for January 27th, 28th, and 29th, 2012. Our feature caller will be Jerry Junck from Mesa, Arizona, and Nebraska. Our feature round dance cuers are Gert-Jan and Suzie Rotscheid from the Netherlands and Georgia. We don't have a clogging instructor yet.

Oregon Federation News: Vivian Fairburn

Oops, sorry. I won't be at the meeting and I don't have a report. I am working for the Census Bureau – 7 days a week.

Haven't had a day off in over a month so don't see it letting up until the end of June. It is a struggle to just get the OFN done.

2nd VICE PRESIDENT: Marilyn (Ron) Schmit

My activities since Mid-Winter have been involved in school and work. I managed to study hard enough to get a 3.3 grade point average and made the Honor Roll for the Winter Term. I have a fairly good chance of doing it again for the Spring Term. Stay tuned.

Work as been on a roller coaster with the prospect of moving the office to Silverton and an hour each way to drive to work. That is now a moot point at least for the upcoming future.

I am involved at many levels from National, State, Council, and Club office in my square dance world. I love all of it and intend to do the best I can in all of my endeavors.

For the ballots I sent 78 ballots out, 51 were returned before May 1st and none of them came after May 1st.

TREASURER: Larry (Carol) Reetz

At the meeting in January 2010 I made the Federation aware that we had run out of cash available to the checking account. We received a repayment of the loan from the 2010 Mid-Winter Festival. Although these funds are not to be used for operating expenses, it provided a buffer. I was able to make it through until late March, when the past treasurer provided an unexpected check for a closed out CD. This was the result of one bank's operation, Columbia River Bank, merging with another, Columbia State Bank. This was a result of the turmoil that has been going on with the banking industry this past year. As a result, the CD that was there we cashed in and withdrew to get it out of the turmoil.

The CD is currently sitting in our funds. We have been researching. Lee Ashwill has been looking at the various banks I have been looking at banks. It is really difficult to find a bank out there that is doing much with a CD for interest right now. There are some that Lee found as low as .035% and others at 1.5%. We are going to make a determination soon and we are going to get those reapplied as CDs possibly doing them short term with the idea that as things progress we can move them in to a little bit longer CDs. Because we did not have a Summer Festival last year I have recommended that we do retain a portion for the needed operation of the Federation in the coming year and obtain some short term CDs for the balance.

The OFN Editor has contacted me and she is updating her QuickBooks. We will be working with Vivian and Bill Reid, our Financial Advisor, as we begin a process of setting up the Oregon Federation News on an amortization process so we can actually look at the financials. When you do a subscription, some of us are doing 1 year, 2 year, 3 years but that should be amortized over the life of the subscription. Some ads have gone in for only 1 month where some may run 2 or 3 months. When and Where is over a 12 month period and we want to set that up where everything is looked at plus it will coincide. She will show exactly what I show when we do our reports. Those are things we are doing.

One expense for the Treasurer was to purchase new checks.

I have received the check from the profit split from the 2010 Mid-Winter Festival. A second payment for BMI/ASCAP was made. A payment for the Youth Scholarship Fund based on \$.50 per dancer in attendance at the Festival was received. All were placed in the account.

MEMBERSHIP: Sylvia Davis

I have sent an email out to the Delegates the information on filling out the forms for the Clubs and Councils. I have gotten a lot of phone calls, which I really appreciate, hoping to clarify it. I am still getting 3 copies of the information. Please, send just 1 copy. It automatically goes to the OFN, the 2nd Vice President, and me. Some people are fighting the form on the computer. I don't know why because it is so much easier. Please fill out as soon as possible. It needs to be in by the Summer Festival. I sincerely hope that you don't wait until the last minute to send in the information. Larry has gotten two checks for the yearly dues. Please tell your clubs not to send them to Larry. I need to have them so I can put them down in my books.

I want to thank Tim because I email him all the time and he is very nice. He doesn't say, "You are really dumb", I can read between the lines. However, I do thank him very much.

There are two clubs that want to join this year. The first club Al Wolf is going to discuss.

Al Wolf: The PAC has received an approved admission to the PAC for a new advanced club called Heads to the Center. They currently have 20 members and they dance at the Milwaukie Grange. Not the Community Club but the Grange, which is a small dancehall near downtown Milwaukie. They dance every Thursday. The name of the club is Heads to the Center.

Sylvia Davis: The second club is the Ronde' Vouz. John Guches is going to discuss that.

John Guches: The Ronde' Vouz Club is a new advanced level Round and Square Dance Club. Primarily rounds. They teach 2, 3, 4, 5, and if they get enough interest they are going to be teaching level 6. They have classes twice a month on Friday nights and they have dances twice a month on Friday nights. It has been a long process trying to get this Club processed through with all the paperwork that is needed. Some of the discussions we have had to have is over their paperwork. The Council, at our last Council meeting, by a very narrow margin, voted them in to the Council. The next process is to proceed with a vote from this organization. The Rogue Sis-Q Council is the Council they will be coming in to. It will bring the number of clubs that we have in this Council up to five. Granted the majority of the dancers are members of other clubs within the Council. We have that issue going just about everywhere we are. They do have the required number of members.

Sylvia Davis: I make a **motion** that we allow Heads to the Center and Ronde' Vouz to join the Federation.

Lee Ashwill: Only one at a time.

Sylvia Davis: I make a **motion** that Heads to the Center be allowed to join our Federation. Seconded by Dennis Marsh.

Lee Ashwill: Would you please pass out the paper just to the Delegates and Officers. On this piece of paper all you need to put is Yea or Nay to accept the Heads to the Center in to the Oregon Federation of Square and Round Dance Clubs.

We will have our Parliamentary count the ballots.

Sylvia Davis: I make a **motion** that the Ronde' Vouz Square Dance Club be allowed in to the Federation. Seconded by Marilyn Schmit.

Lee Ashwill: The **motion** to have the Heads to the Center join the Oregon Federation has passed with a vote of 17 to 1.

The Federation has voted **Yes** on the Ronde' Vouz joining the Federation by a vote of 13 to 6.

Insurance/USDA: Kay (Jim) Rogers

Thank you all for the great work on reporting new members. It is wonderful to be getting these new members in.

Remember to give USDA time to process any requests for Additional Insured. In the summer they take longer. We may be on vacation or dancing and the USDA Insurance person also travels and goes to the meetings. So remember to allow extra time.

Sylvia Davis: I have gotten a whole bunch of forms already through the email and I really appreciate it. I do ask that you have them in by the Summer Festival. I do appreciate it for those who have sent it very promptly.

PAST PRESIDENT: John (Glory) Guches

My kitchen help has not showed up yet this morning. I guess they decided they were going to sleep in. Last night for your cooking pleasure we had Bill Robson and Steve Spleen that did the cooking of the chicken for you. Bill's wife Maggie and our 2nd Vice President, Tom, and his wife helped in the kitchen. This group of officers from the Charlie Brown Club stepped forward and made last night a very big success for us. I want to make sure that the Federation is well aware of that. I didn't put that in my report Dale but if you can see that it get in there I would appreciate it. I will make sure they get a copy of it too.

The weather was warm and sunny in Bend in April making it an excellent day to dance with Jasmó.

We had a good turn out with over 80 people enjoying themselves with the calling of Bob Ewing and the cueing of Dave Cooper. Don Bramhall kept everything moving as our MC. Lonna and her group provided excellent help in the kitchen. Setting up, serving refreshments from all the wonderful snacks everyone brought and the cleanup after the dance. Glory and I thank you for all your help.

Although there have been significant changes in the P&Ps approved at the last two meetings, a decision was made to hold off on distributing updates until the committee finished its changes. We expect to do a full reprint of the P&Ps in September. This will actually end up being cheaper than doing updates piecemeal.

DELEGATE MEETING REPORT: Glory Guches

We had no motions to review for the meeting. There are two new clubs being presented by Membership Chairman, Sylvia Davis. The Ronde' Vouz Club questions were answered by myself; the other club was mentioned by the delegate.

Barbara Tipton asked the delegates to remember National Square Dance Week, September 12 – 18, 2010. September 18, 2010 Square Dancers will dance in the State Capitol Rotunda from 2 to 4pm. Leonard Snodgrass will be one of two callers. They are looking for a second caller to give Leonard a break. One caller has been suggested, Bob Ewing. Barbara also asked the clubs and councils to list what activities they would be doing in recognition of National Square dance Week.

A question was brought up about the State funding Square Dancing Advisements. Could the State please help out with the cost of advertising to hopefully bring in more new recruits for square dancing?

A request for an Education Committee to train on subjects from: How to be a Delegate, Officer of a Club or State level, how to get and retain square dancers, Square Dance Computer Classes were some of the requests. It was suggested these classes could be held at Mid-Winter and Summer Festivals. Or is it possible to go to clubs or councils to do some of these education classes?

Another concern brought up at the meeting is the OFN magazine. The inside page listing officers, council editors and other important information for the square dancers. The fact that the delegates are not listed was raised. It was felt that if someone wished to contact their council delegate or another council delegate how could this be done if the delegates were not listed.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. CPA (IRS) Committee Report (Bill Reid) – No Report
2. Practices & Procedures update (Floyd Bard)

Floyd Bard: I have six motions for changes to the P&Ps. The motions will be made individually and have a second, if there will be one. There will be a brief time for discussion and the operative word is brief. I will then ask for each motion to be postponed to be voted on at the next State meeting in July. This will formalize each motion in the Minutes and allow each Area Delegate to take the motions to their area

councils. I think that is only fair to take it back to your councils so you can discuss it and then come back and vote on it.

Motion #1: I **move** that the BMI/ASCAP Coordinator P&P be changed to update the \$100.00 BMI license fee to the current BMI license fee of \$140.00 (line 18), and change the per attendance fee of \$0.050 per attendee to the current attendance fee of \$0.078 per attendee (line 19). Change the ASCAP registered attendance fee of \$0.064 per attendee to the current registered attendance fee of \$0.078 and add per attendee just following the amount, which should read – “\$0.078 per attendee” (line 28). Insert the following sentence: “For ASCAP there is a minimum event fee, currently \$90.00”. After “recorded music.” (line 29). Change sample memorandum to reflect the current attendance fee of \$0.078 per attendee (lines 16 & 21). Add, “Minimum fee is \$90.00” at the end of line 21. Seconded by Larry Reetz. Discussion followed.

Gary Sohn: I **move** to have this motion postponed, to be voted on at the next meeting. Seconded by John Guches. **Motion** carried.

Motion #2: I **move** that the Publicity and State Reporter P&P be changed as follows:

Paragraph 1 – remove the last three sentences “Their year runs from March through March. In the past we have exchanged ads in out(r) festival booklets. We list our features State festival callers and curers in their books. They list places to buy the National Square Dance Directory in Oregon.” Add the following at the end of Paragraph 1 – “The Clubs and Councils are encouraged to update their contact information online with the NSDDirectory.com (use code F09-0106 to modify information online). It is free.

Paragraph 2 (line 8) – change 1st of the month to 5th of the month.

Paragraph 6 – Writes a column for each Oregon Federation News with news deadline of 1st of the month preceding publication (i.e. 1st of September for October magazine), limited to 100 words.

Paragraph 8 – National Square Dance Directory: Advertise our two (2) Festivals on a share basis. Ad in National Directory for one (1) page in each of our Festival’s program. Due in October preceding year of event (1996 for 1997 Festival).

Paragraph 9 (line 23) – Add “The” in front of Oregonian.

Paragraph 10 – Remove “If possible, hand delivered is better than mail.”

Line 32, 33, 34 – Remove reference to National Square Dance Directory.

Line 32 – Insert “footnotes wa@yahoo.com.”

Line 35 – Add traveloregon.com after Oregon State Tourism Bureau.

Line 39 – change “webmaster, reports to” to “webmaster, works with”.

So those are all the changes we have and the **motion** I am making for all the changes to the Publicity and State Reporter. Seconded by Larry Reetz. Discussion followed.

John Guches: I **move** to have this motion postponed, to be voted on at the next meeting. Seconded by Dennis Marsh. **Motion** carried.

Motion #3: I **move** that the Reimbursement of Lodging/Mileage Expense of the P&P (line 7) change 2nd Vice President to 1st Vice President. Also, change (line 6) “are mailed to eligible attendees with their agendas” to “are available from the Oregon Federation of Square and Round Dance Clubs website”. Seconded by Dennis Marsh. Discussion followed.

Dennis Marsh: I **move** to have this motion postponed, to be voted on at the next meeting. Seconded by Sylvia Davis. **Motion** carried.

Motion #4: I **move** that Elected Officers and Delegate Duties of the P&P change to the following.

Add paragraph 6 – As reads, “Each newly elected officer and area council delegate should contact their predecessor (if applicable) between election and installation to learn about the particulars of their respective positions.” Seconded by Linda Danner. Discussion followed.

Gary Sohn: I **move** to have this motion postponed, to be voted on at the next meeting. Seconded by Larry Reetz. **Motion** carried.

Motion #5: I **move** that the 1st Vice President/President Elect of the P&P change as follows.

Paragraph 9 – remove “Each incoming officer should contact their predecessor between election and installation to find out the particulars of their job.”

Line 24 – change the word “However,” to “Schedule”.

Line 25 – remove “should be held.” Revised sentence would read, “Schedule a joint meeting between the incoming and outgoing Executive Boards.” Seconded by Larry Reetz. Discussion followed.

Dennis Marsh: I **move** to have this motion postponed, to be voted on at the next meeting. Seconded by John Guches. **Motion** carried.

Floyd Bard: The last motion is on the Grant Fund Committee. We had some issues in past meetings on how we handled requests for grants. I looked at that Grant Fund Committee and it has been an active committee. It has been in the P&Ps but it hasn't been used. It has a very cumbersome timeline. It takes over a year if you follow the timelines for somebody to request money from the Federation to the point where it could be approved and the actual funds distributed. This is only eliminating these timelines and basically saying we can conduct business a lot quicker just through the motions on the floor and having the Grant Committee, which is made up of the Past President, 1st Vice President and the Treasurer, working with the areas and the clubs a lot quicker than what the P&Ps say. Here is the motion.

Motion #6: I **move** that the Grant Fund Committee of the P&P be changed as follows:

Line 15 through 30 – Remove.

Line 26 – Change “Mail five (5) signed copies...” to “Mail two (2) signed copies...”.

Line 27 – “see Item 11 of application” should read: “see Item 10 of application”.

Line 30 and 31 (Information for Grant Allocations) – Change “mail four (4) copies...” to “mail one (1) copy...”.

Line 31 – Insert “and all supporting documents” between “the application” and “to the State...”.

Lines 30 and 31 (Information for Grant Allocations) – will read: “3. The Area will make its recommendations and so notify the applicant. The area will then mail one (1) copy of the application and all supporting documents to the State Federation Grant Fund Committee Chairperson (the Past President).”

Section VII-26 Grant Fund Application:

Lines 6 through 8 – Remove remaining sentences after the word “President” on Line 6 and replace with “in a timely manner to ensure prompt processing by the Areas and Grant Committee.”

Section VII-29 Grant Fund Application:

Lines 12 and 13 – Change “Item 11” to “Item 10”. Remove “and three (3) copies”. Replace in Line 13 “before June 1st.” with “within one (1) week of approval or disapproval.” Seconded by Sylvia Davis. Discussion followed.

Larry Reetz: I **move** to have this motion postponed, to be voted on at the next meeting. Seconded by Dennis Marsh. **Motion** carried.

Lee Ashwill: I would like to thank Floyd, Ray Jones, and David Stutzman, and the input from Tim I am sure. Thank you guys you are doing a heck of good job and I certainly appreciate it.

John Guches: Earlier during my report I mentioned a group of people that stepped in and made this weekend happen for everybody. Today we have in the kitchen, right now, the Co-Presidents of the Charlie Brown Squares Bill and Maggie Robson.

Lee Ashwill: Well we have our election results and I want to thank everybody who filled out a nomination form and ran for an office. Hopefully you will do it again next year because I am going to be looking for nominees.

Your Board membership next year will be ran by a very capable Mr. Floyd Bard. The results of the vote, and it is something that Tim doesn't remember ever happening and I certainly do not remember it ever happening, we had a tie. In the Practices and Procedures it says when there is a tie the President, the 1st Vice President, and the immediate Past President will each vote to break that tie. I think it is great that we have that much competition in our activity.

Dennis Marsh: I make the **motion** that we destroy the ballots. Seconded by Larry Reetz. **Motion** carried.

Floyd Bard: I received about a week ago a request from Charles Garner who dances with the Bachelor 'N' Bachelorettes in the Portland Area. Some of you may have heard him call as a guest caller at some of the dances. He has been practicing for the last 14 months. He has attended one of Daryl Clendenin clinics during the winter of 2009. He is not only being mentored by Daryl Clendenin, but also by Les Seeley and Jim Hattrick. I understand that he is doing a really good job. Well, Daryl comes in and puts on a Callers College at Cle Elum, Washington, from July 4th through July 8th. Chuck would like to go to that. He has already received a scholarship from Caller Lab. He is going to put on a Donation Dance on June 13th at the Abernathy Grange in Oregon City to make some money to help pay for himself to go. He is doing what I consider the right thing. He is

trying to afford it. He and his significant other is taking time off of work to do this and already have this approved. He is going to go.

I know that in the past we have given out funds to callers through the caller grant program that Lee kind of got started about a year ago. We have given this fund out to two other dancers.

I would like to make a **motion** that the Federation approves a caller grant of \$380.00 to send Chuck Garner to Daryl Clendenin's Caller College. Seconded by Sylvia Davis. **Motion** carried.

Floyd Bard: I have an item that is related to this and this has to do with the new callers and new cuers that are coming in to our great event and aren't really associated with a Federated club. We talked about this in the past about having them included in our Directory as callers and cuers. They probably belong to Federated clubs, they are certified, if they have gone through the training they are certified callers, and adding them to the Directory so our clubs know who they are and they can contact easily. One of the things these new callers and cuers need is the experience. For the clubs to get them in their hall, on their stage and doing the work, granted they could put their information in the OFN. I think the OFN serves a different group than those who packs these Directories with us everywhere we go. I would like to see our crew that does the Directory, the 2nd Vice President and Membership Chairman, to add these new callers and new cuers in to the Directory.

John Guches: I understand that we do need new callers. We always need new callers. The question I have is, in some of the clubs that are out there the callers from the different local areas, in this case our council, we give them an honorary membership in the club is what we do. They don't pay dues, a lot of times they don't even pay to come to the dance because that is one of our policies. How would this affect those individuals that don't pay dues to a Federated club?

Insurance and Non-federated dancers: We had a long discussion. In order to protect your grange/hall from liability, TVC recommends to place a sign near your sign-in sheet that reads: Non-Federated Dancers Are Not Covered By The Oregon Federation's Secondary Insurance.

This was a topic of discussion at our last TVC meeting in May where a former insurance executive provided some information. An opinion by a former insurance executive for the information of the TVC Council: Insurance for many of the granges does not provide "Premises Medical Coverage". (Note: The Aloha Grange is one exception, as it does have "Premises Medical Coverage.") So if a "non-federated" dancer is injured due to their own negligence while dancing at "most" granges (or other venues that don't have premises medical), the "non-federated" dancer will have only their own personal coverage for medical expenses. (Note: If a dancer is injured as the result of negligence of the property owner or another dancer, they do have the right to make a liability claim against and/or sue that party.) On the other hand, federated dancers have liability coverage under the Oregon Federation policy. They would be protected by that coverage if they hurt another person or damaged property while at a dance. The non-federated would have no such protection and would have to rely solely on their own liability coverage, if any. It was suggested that TVC clubs develop a sign that reads: Non-Federated Dancers Are Not Covered By The Oregon Federation's Secondary Insurance, and place it near the sign-in sheet.
